AttendanceWhole-school attendance to date is 93.5% which is below the government target of 96% but is an increase of 2% compared to February.However, we have do have an increasing number of parents taking their children out of school for family holidays. In these cases, both parents are sent letters explaining that if their child is marked with 15 sessions (7.5 school days) over the current and previous term, as per county guidelines, the school will apply for a fine to be issued.While 90% is a very good figure to receive in a test, when this is a child's attendance figure, it is actually very bad.
